NEWLY ELECTED COUNCILWOMAN TO HOST HER FIRST NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING IN WARD 6

JACKSON, MI - Councilwoman Colleen Sullivan, the newly elected representative for Ward 6 in the city of Jackson, will host her first neighborhood meeting at 6 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 6. The meeting is set to take place within Frost Elementary School's cafeteria, 1226 S. Wisner St. in Jackson.

Sullivan said she doesn't plan to feature any guest speakers or have any specific matters to discuss prior to the meeting.

"As a new representative, I want to gauge my constituents and let them drive the conversation," Sullivan said. "I want to touch on issues that they want to discuss and move forward from there."

Sullivan was elected to the Jackson City Council on Tuesday, Nov. 7. She immediately took her seat on the governing body in place of former councilman Derek Dobies, who won the election for Jackson's mayor in the same election.

Sullivan is an Albion College graduate and community advocate who has volunteered and mentored special needs students and community members. She has also worked as a production stage manager and a records manager in the legal field.

"I look forward to representing the 6th Ward," she said. "This will be the first of many community meetings I have planned to keep an open line of communication between my constituents and city government."
