MILLAGE RENEWAL FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SERVICES IN THE CITY OF JACKSON

The Jackson Area Transportation Authority (JATA) is encouraging all city registered voters to vote on August 2nd. JATA will be requesting a one mill transit renewal. The renewal is not a new tax. The renewal simply allows JATA to continue to operate at its' current level. Without local support, JATA would have to drastically reduce services.

All polling locations are accessible for voters with disabilities.
